

Lesson Plan: Exploring Capital Cities

Year Group: 11

Subject: Geography - Capital Cities

Lesson Length: 30 minutes

Lesson Objectives:

- Understand the concept of a capital city and its significance.
- Identify and locate major capital cities around the world.
- Explore the cultural, political, and economic roles of capital cities.

Warm-Up Activity (5 minutes):

Activity: Capital City Match-Up

- Students will be given a list of countries and a separate list of cities.
- They will work in pairs to match each country with its correct capital city.
- Example: Match France with Paris.

Introduction (5 minutes):

- Briefly discuss what a capital city is and its importance in a country.
- Explain how capital cities often serve as the political, cultural, and economic hubs of a country.

Main Activity (15 minutes):

Activity: Capital City Exploration

1. **Group Work:** Divide the class into small groups. Assign each group a continent.
2. **Research Task:** Each group will research the capital cities of the countries within their assigned continent. They should focus on:
 - The name of the capital city.
 - Key landmarks or cultural sites.
 - The role of the capital city in the country's government and economy.
3. **Presentation:** Each group will present their findings to the class, highlighting interesting facts about the capital cities they researched.

Conclusion (5 minutes):

- Recap the key points discussed in the lesson.
- Ask students to share one new thing they learned about a capital city today.
- Encourage students to think about how capital cities influence global interactions.
